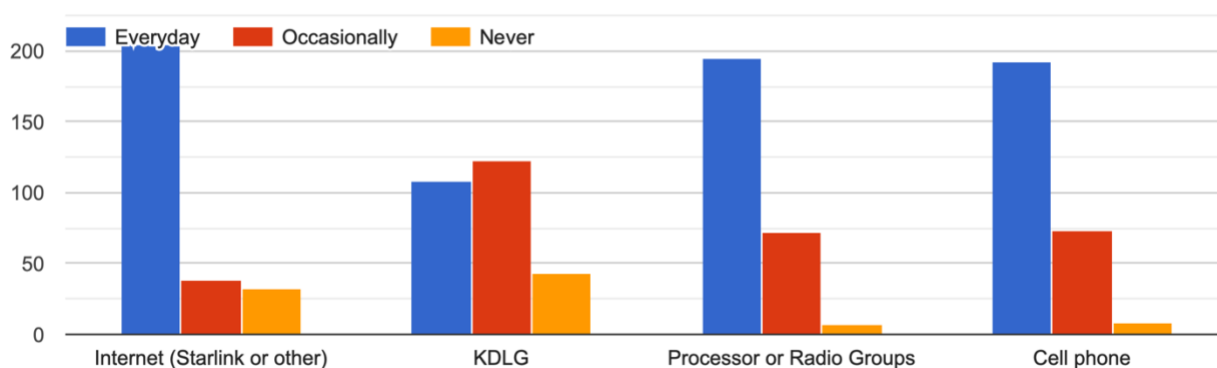


BBRSDA DRIFT FLEET SURVEY RESULTS - January 12, 2026:

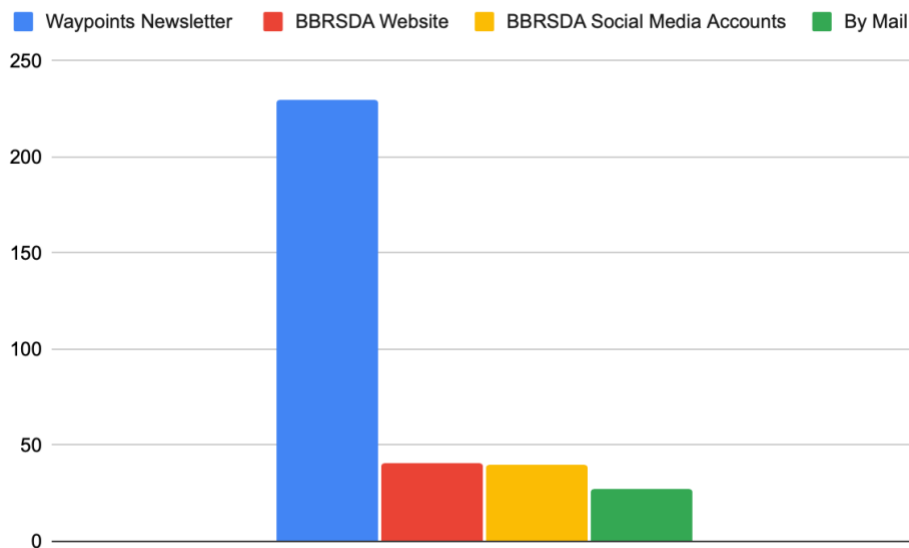
IMPORTANT: BBRSDA's Member Survey garnered 242 responses from drift permit holders representing 13.4% of all Bristol Bay drift permit holders. Based on this sample size, the results have a +/- 5.86% margin of error at the 95% confidence level.

NOTE: Some questions allowed survey-takers to make multiple selections which is why some charts have more than 242 data points.

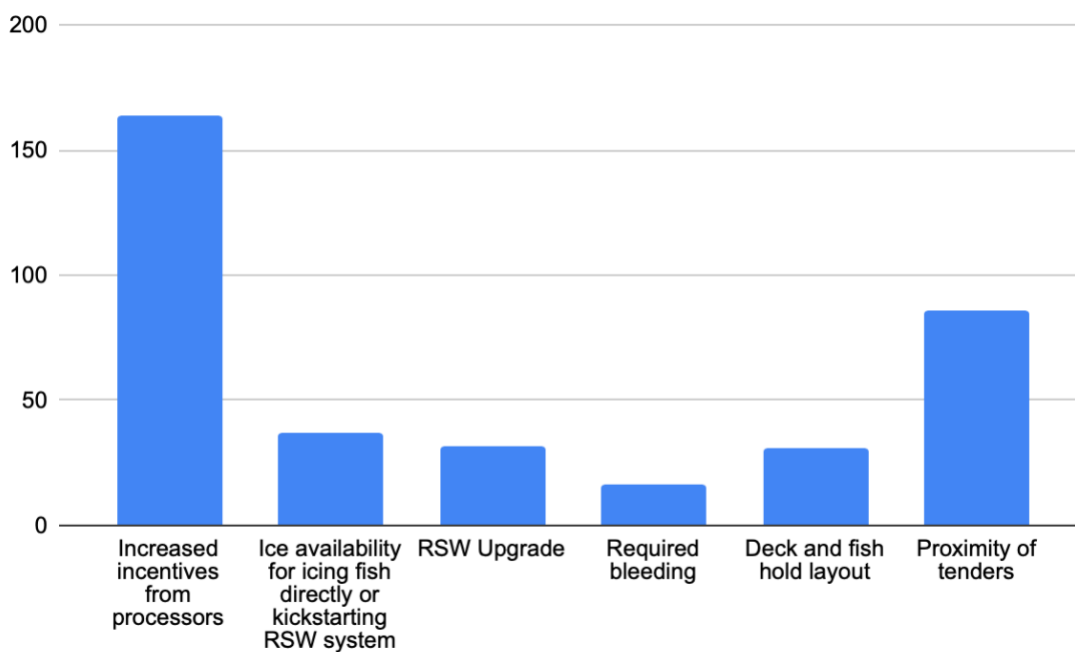
#1) How do you get information while you are fishing?



#2 How do you prefer to get information from BBRSDA throughout the year?

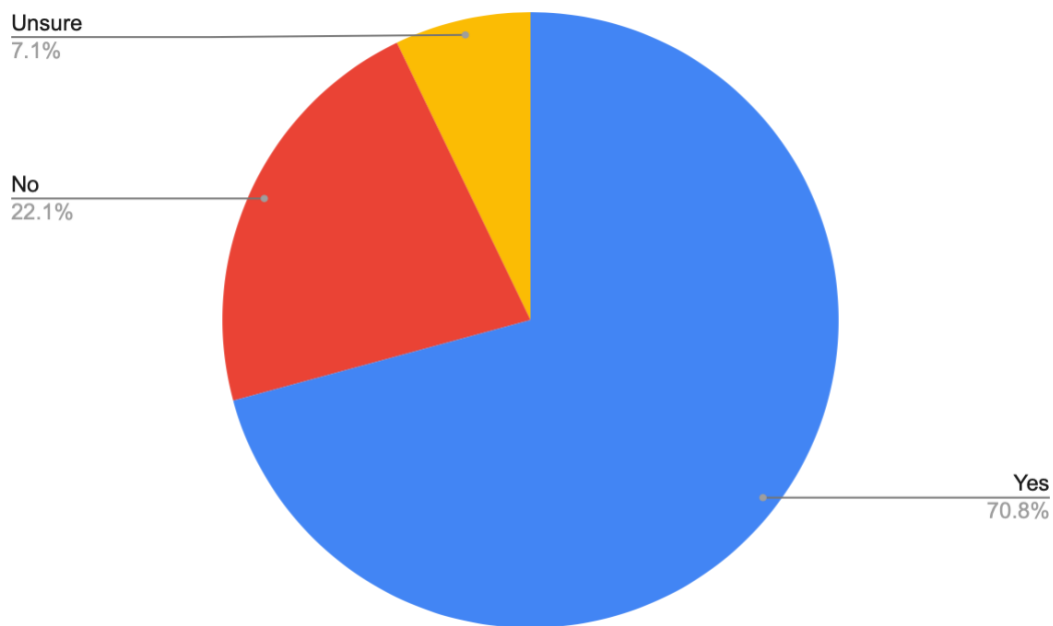


#3) What would most help you and your vessel improve the quality of the fish you deliver?

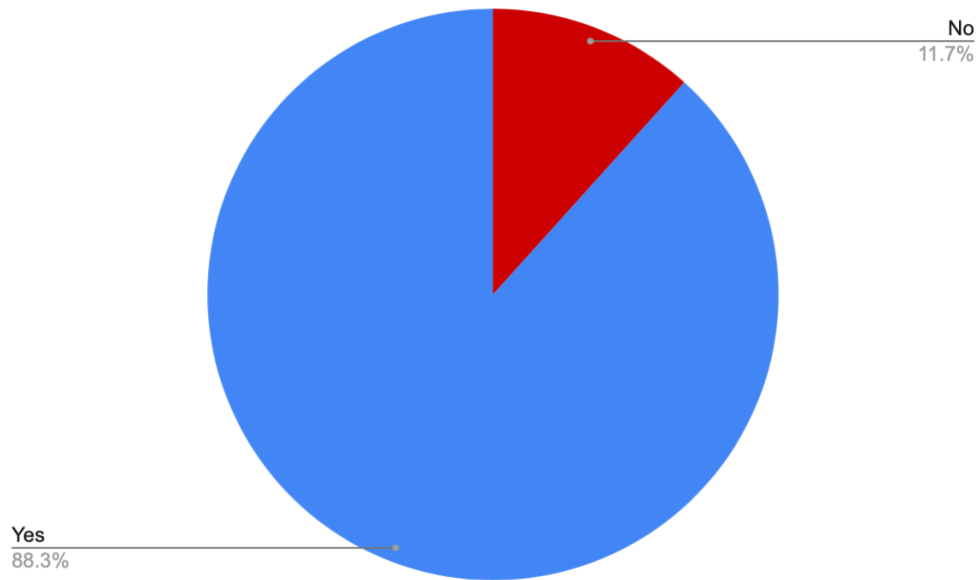


#4) Do you support permit stacking?

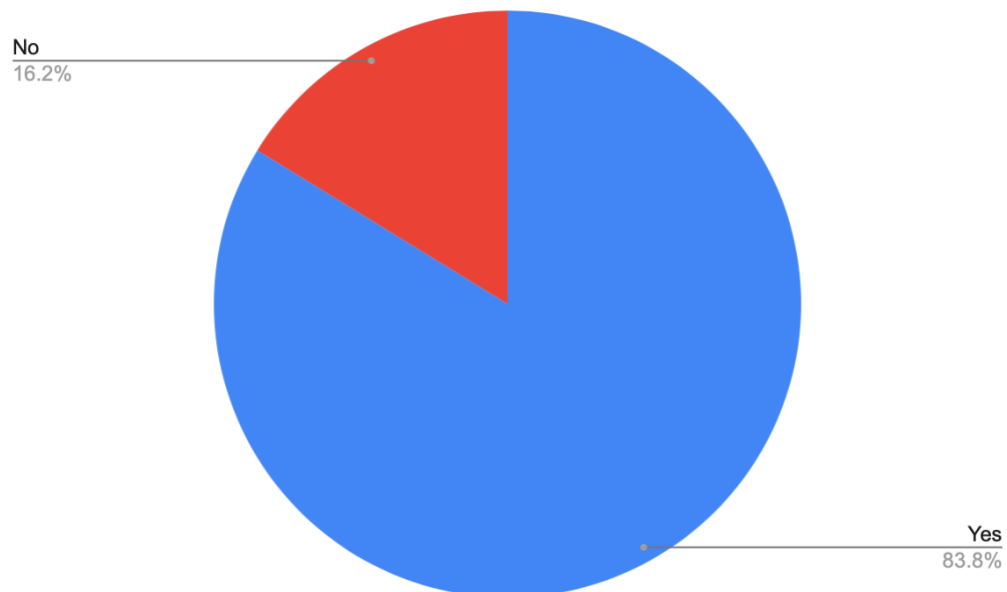
Permit stacking refers to one individual being permitted to own and operate two S03T permits and fish 200 fathoms of gear.



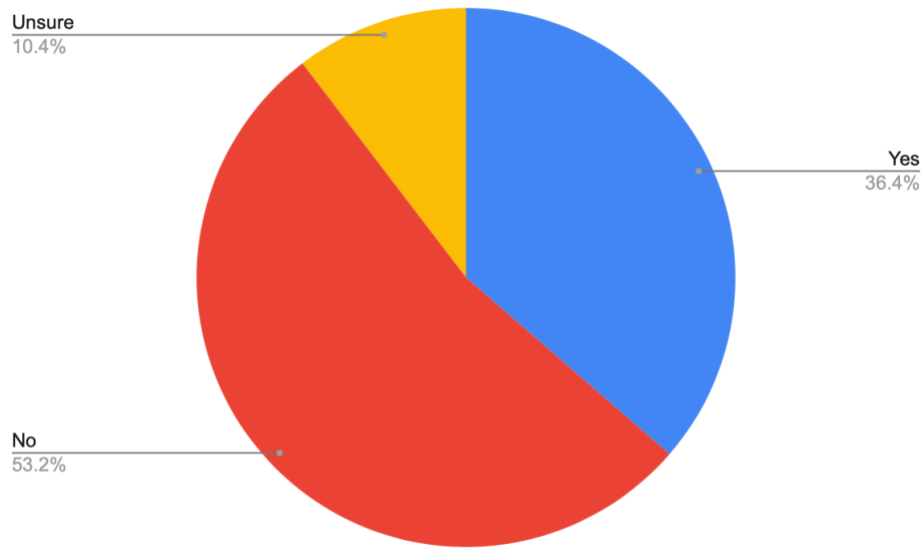
#5) Do you support BBRSDA investing time and money to explore ways of using technology (sonar, AI, drones, cameras) to enhance fish counting in Bristol Bay?



#6) Do you support BBRSDA's efforts to fund and explore new methods for counting King Salmon and other fish in the Nushagak River system?

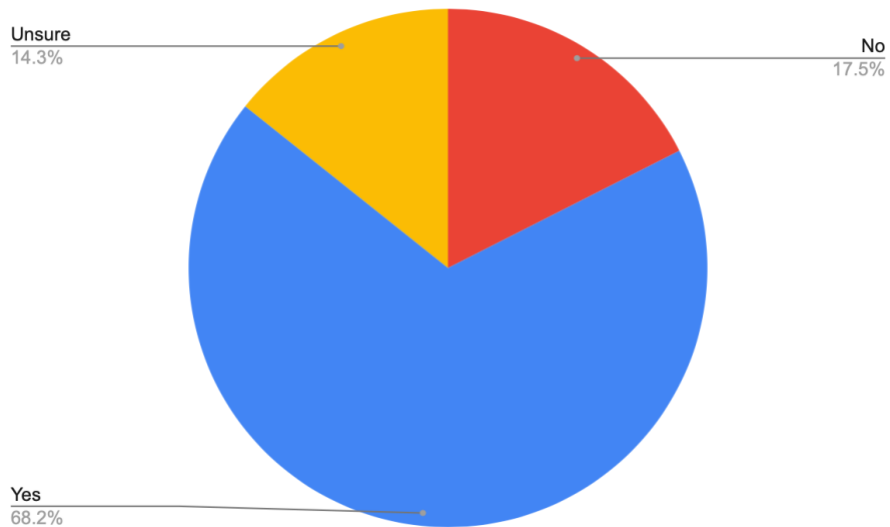


#7) Do you support **changes to** the 32-foot limit for vessels in Bristol Bay?



#8) Do you support authorizing fishing in a General District once escapement goals have been achieved in all districts?

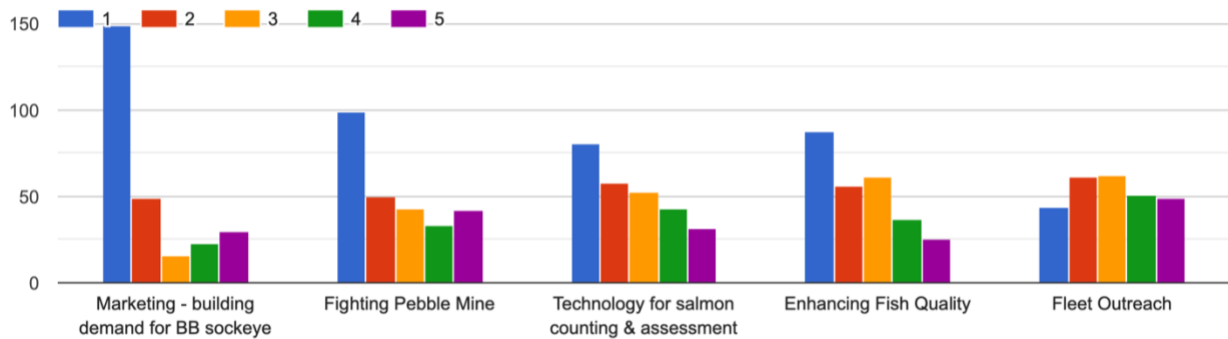
